GCISD Check Acceptance Policy

The District **will accept** personal checks for payment when presented under the following conditions:

- All checks are commercially printed and numbered
- Checks should be written using blue or black ink
- Checks include:
 - o Name, address, and telephone number
 - o Current date
 - o Student name and ID number

^{*}Registration and payment serve as confirmation that parents and students agree to abide by the Summer School Discipline Plan and all other GCISD policies.

The District will not accept:

- Checks without a pre-printed name and address (no counter checks/starter checks/temporary checks)
- Checks with an expiration date (credit card account checks)
- Pre or Post-dated checks

A person writing a check to the District agrees that, if the check is returned for any reason, that it may be represented electronically on the same account. The fee established by law, in addition to the face value, may be debited from the same account. These fees, as permitted by state law, may be debited as a paper draft or an electronic funds transfer, at the District's discretion.

Specifically, per Texas Business & Commerce Code Annotated §3.506, the service fee for returned checks is \$30. Each dishonored item is subject to the applicable state returned check fees plus sales tax. (Note that the fee structure will be adjusted accordingly for any amendments to Texas state law.)

Grapevine-Colleyville Independent School District Secondary Summer School Discipline Plan

The summer school program is designed to enhance the regular school year program. The program is intensified, due to the length of time spent in class, in such a way that one day of summer school equals four school days during the regular school year. For this reason, it is extremely important that students be present every day and on time for class.

The following rules, as well as all GCISD policies, will be in effect during secondary summer school.

ALL STUDENTS

 Any student removed from class due to a behavioral problem shall be counted as being absent. Any student who has a major rule violation may be removed from the program and there will be NO refund of tuition.

1st referral – parent phone call/conference/removal from campus 2nd referral – withdrawal from class with **NO** refund

- All summer school students will adhere to the GCISD Student Code of Conduct.
- Teachers will announce any additional classroom rules during the course.
- Students must make arrangements with the teacher, at the teacher's convenience, to make up any work missed due to an absence.
- Students will be in designated areas only.
- The use of electronic devices is prohibited during instructional time unless with the permission of the classroom teacher. The district's ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY will be enforced. No exceptions. Items will be confiscated until the end of the student's class day. Please make sure you are aware of this district policy and the actions that can result.

ATTENDANCE

- A maximum of one absence may be accrued per class per session. Should a student be absent the first two days of each session, the student will be dropped from that summer school session with no tuition reimbursement. A second absence beyond the second day of each session will result in the student not receiving credit for the course and the grade will be recorded on the student's transcript with an indicator of credit denial due to attendance. Three (3) tardies will equal one full absence in that individual class. Tardy is defined as arriving within the first twenty minutes of the class period. Thereafter the student is marked absent.
- If students are lacking credit due to attendance, Seat Time will not be offered.
- GCISD Summer School maintains a closed campus every day, including lunch. This
 means that students are not allowed to travel off campus unless they are finished with their
 classes for the day. Visitors are not allowed on campus at any time.

FINAL EXAMS

Final exams will be administered at 7:30 AM for morning classes and 9:00 AM for afternoon classes on the last day of each A or B session.

PARKING

Students must park in the main student parking lot behind the school. Students may not park in the parking lot by the football field. Students are not allowed in the parking lot once they arrive at school or during class time. Students loitering in the parking lot or outside the building will be considered truant and an absence will be assigned.

DRESS CODE

- Each student's hair will be clean and well groomed at all times and shall not obstruct vision. No extreme style or color will be allowed. The color of the hair must be of natural colors. For example, no red, blue, purple, or other colors will be allowed. This includes the shaving of symbols or words into the student's hair. In addition, students will not be allowed to wear spiked hair (Liberty or Unicorn styles).
- Students will be expected to maintain a neat and clean appearance in regard to facial hair such as mustaches, beards, goatees, and sideburns. Facial hair must be of natural colors. Apparel should not display risqué prints or symbols, gang graffiti or monikers, lewd, vulgar, obscene, or suggestive language/design. Advertisements or symbols that promote or depict drugs, alcohol, tobacco products, violence, or Satanism are prohibited on all apparel, jewelry, and accessories. No pentagrams, skulls, inverted crosses or serpents on shirts, jewelry, or hats will be allowed. No chains, handcuffs, jewelry, or accessories that suggest weaponry will be allowed. In addition, trench coats and dusters are prohibited as are any apparel with sexually explicit, suggestive or offensive language, symbols or pictures. Also, apparel with swastikas, Nazi symbolism, and Confederate flags are not allowed.
- Hats, caps, forehead bands, bandannas, sunglasses or other head coverings and distracting accessories will not be worn in the school building. Students shall not be allowed to display body piercings that cause disruptions of/or interference with normal school operations.
- Students are to wear shoes or sandals at all times.
- Proper underclothing must be worn at all times and cannot be visible.
- No apparel considered revealing, such as shirts tied at the waist, shirts that expose the midriff (shirts must cover the midriff at all times), halter tops or tops with spaghetti straps, torn or "holey" apparel, fishnet shirts, tank tops (boys and girls), strapless or off-the-shoulder blouses or dresses, spandex clothing, or cut off T-shirts will be permitted. If a normal bra can be seen the shirt, top, or blouse will not be allowed. Sleeveless blouses/tops must have the outside edge of the sleeve touch the outside edge of the shoulder (no cut-in sleeves). Tube tops with proper underclothing must be worn with an over blouse and must be buttoned halfway up. Opaque or colored hosiery will not be considered pants when worn alone or with a long sweater or shirt.
- Shorts or skirts must allow students to be able to stand, sit and/or bend with modesty. These must be fingertip length when shoulders are relaxed.
- Gang attire: clothing, jewelry, grooming styles, shoes, or boots that identify a student as a member of a gang or that is associated with acts of hate or violence will not be allowed.
 Attire of this nature has a tendency to change and is reviewed periodically.
- The administration of each campus will provide proper notification to students prior to any change in dress and grooming standards.
- Students who are sent home because of a dress code violation will receive an unexcused absence.

The building administration will use its discretion in questions concerning the dress code. Where there is a question on the dress or appearance of a student, the school administrator's decision will be final.

TOBACCO-ALCOHOL-DRUGS

- Students may not use or possess tobacco, snuff, chewing tobacco, cigarettes, cigars, pipes, or electronic cigarettes.
- While on school grounds, while attending a school function, or while en route to or from school or school functions on transportation made available by GCISD, students are prohibited by this code from possessing, using, selling, attempting to sell, or being under the influence of: an alcoholic beverage, an inhalant or other substance used to induce intoxication; marijuana, a hallucinogenic, amphetamine or barbiturate, or any other substance prohibited under the Texas Controlled Substances Act or the Federal Drug Abuse Prevention Control Act.
- A student who possesses or is under the influence of a drug authorized by a licensed physician through a prescription specifically for that student's use shall not be considered to have violated this provision.

TRANSPORTATION

<u>Transportation is not provided by GCISD</u> for Secondary Summer School courses that are for Initial Credit or Credit Recovery. Transportation is provided by GCISD only for STAAR/EOC courses.

TOUCH SYSTEMS DATA ENTRY for 6th, 7th or 8th grade **Initial Credit - One Semester Course**

High School Elective Credit - is NOT required for graduation

This course teaches the skill of keyboarding by touch with speed and accuracy. Students will enhance reading, writing, computing, communications, and reasoning skills while applying them to the business environment through correctly formatting business letters, reports, and tables. Initial Credit - One Semester Course
